2020 Women's Pennant Competition Conditions

A copy of these Rules & Conditions is to be given to every pennant player, by the Club Captain and prior to the start of every pennant season. It is expected that every person given a copy will take the time to read these Rules & Conditions.

1. Format:

1.1 General

Pennant is a club team's match play competition played between Member Clubs and Associate Clubs of the North Eastern District Golf Association (NEDGA). The Match Committee of the NEDGA shall administer the pennant competition and the conditions set down each year and shall alter the Rules & Conditions prior to each season where it sees fit. This will include determining whether the format will be handicap or scratch match play for each division. Full handicap difference for handicap match play shall be given. The Match Index to be used, shall be that used at each club that in most instances may not be the International Index.

A pennant season consists of 'round robin' rounds of contests between clubs in each division, followed by a Final.

Individual match play games will be played under the current R&A Rules Ltd *Rules of Golf*, these Conditions, and any local rules/temporary local rules determined by the host club and/or NEDGA Match Committee.

No player is allowed to play on a Daily Handicap greater than 45.0 regardless of their G.A Handicap.

1.2 Divisions

The Match Committee of the NEDGA shall determine the number of divisions and number of teams in each division prior to the commencement of the season. The Match Committee will place teams in appropriate divisions so as to maximize the number of rounds and as far as possible equalize the number of teams in each division. These decisions will be made in the fairest possible way based on the number of players and their respective handicaps that are submitted by each club. An average of each team's handicap is used as a guide when determining divisions for handicap match play.

Clubs must submit their Player List by email to nedgawomen@gmail.com by the end of January or earlier if requested by NEDGA committee. Each player's correct Golfink No. must be included. Clubs may group their players into proposed team combinations (in G.A.Handicap order) and request the number of teams they wish to enter for that particular season.

When the Player Lists are submitted, each club must nominate **as many playing dates as possible** that their course is available to host pennant.

The G.A. Handicap limit for Division One shall be 20.0. See also 4.3 & 4.4

1.3 Players not on team Player List at start of season

The Match Committee acknowledges it may be necessary at times, for a club to use a player or players not on the original Player List submitted before the draw was completed. This is not prohibited as emergency players can be required but it is not acceptable for these players to be used more than once or twice. If the Match Committee determines that, had these player or players been submitted on the original Player List it would have altered which Division the team was placed in, the Committee has the right to not allow them to play in the team as emergencies or substitutes.

1.4 Pennant Season and Draw

The pennant season shall commence as close to the start of March as is possible and shall continue until the round robin series of matches in each division has been completed. Wherever possible, no matches shall be played on Public Holidays. **All** matches shall be played on a Monday.

1.5 Starting times & tees

The scheduled starting time for each match will take into account the distance to be travelled by the teams. The starting time shall be 8.30 am unless a club has requested prior to the draw a different starting time in which case this time shall be indicated in the draw.

1.6 Playing in Fours

Players will play in twos with the exception of Yarrawonga/ Mulwala where they shall play in fours. Once started, players may separate into 2's if space allows in front of them.

When playing in 4's, there is to be **no communication between team members** that could influence a player's choice of club or course management. Penalty for breach of this will be loss of hole.

When a division with six teams is scheduled at these courses, for equity reasons, the host club is to provide two extra players on similar handicaps to play with the single pair. As the extra players are not playing pennant they shall not interfere with the match and should not unduly hold up play.

Please refer to the 'Format for Playing in 4's' procedure included in this Handbook (p.14).

2. Host Club Responsibilities:

- (i) Each host club must ensure that its course is available at the scheduled time and in good playing condition to host a listed match. If a club notifies the NEDGA at least 48 hours prior to the commencement of a round that its course is unfit for play, the Match Committee will source another venue and notify the Captain of the relevant Clubs.
- (ii) Host clubs are to ensure they have the Slope Rating for the course where play is to take place, displayed in a prominent position so that all players are aware of their correct handicap for the day.
- (iii) The host club must provide a person to receive the Pennant Team & Score Sheet from the Team Captains on arrival and then to record the results after play.
- (iv) The host club must provide a **competent** person who will act as the **Starter**. The Starter will:
 - Ensure the players are aware of any local rules. It is recommended that a list of such local rules be given to each pair of contestants. However, if this is not convenient, the starter shall announce them to each pair.
 - Send the field out in the order shown on the Pennant Team & Score Sheet although the players will play in reverse order i.e. 5-1.
 - Remind players that they must not carry more than 14 clubs and of the requirements for using motorised carts and distance measuring devices.
 - Announce the handicap difference between the players. The Captain of each team is responsible for allocating where strokes are given or received. This is not the responsibility of the starter or host club representative.
- (v) **Emailing results.** The host club shall email the Pennant Team & Score Sheet to nedgawomen@gmail.com after the team Captains sign it and by 5pm on the day of the matches being played. An email with a clear photo or scan of the Pennant Team & Score Sheet attached is acceptable.
- (vi) **Catering:** Tea/coffee with biscuits/sticky buns is to be provided free of charge by the host club when players arrive at the course. The club will also provide sandwiches with mixed fillings as well as slices and/or fruit for lunch for the players at a cost of \$10.00 per player. Team Captains shall collect the money for their players and hand over the \$50 to the host club prior to commencement of play. Players with special dietary requirements are to advise the host club 24 hours prior to the commencement of play of those requirements. Clubs must try to accommodate this.

(vii) The host club may appoint a person to be responsible for the pace of play.

3. Eligibility:

3.1. Clubs. Each Club participating in the Pennant competition must be financial in accordance with the NEDGA Constitution and By-Laws or be an Associate Member Club of the NEDGA, prior to the first round of the season. Any Club that does not satisfy this requirement may be precluded from participating in that season's pennant or shall forfeit points received during the period it was not financial.

3.2. Players

- (i) A player is eligible to play pennant for an eligible club if on the dates she plays for that club she:
- holds a registered Golf Australia Handicap
 - is a financial member with playing rights of that club
 - is a financial member of the NEDGA or a financial member of an Associate Club of the NEDGA.

Note: The Club membership must be an annual or longer term membership. The membership must not be in a social, non-playing, temporary, substantially restricted or similar category. Junior members are eligible to play pennant.

- (ii) If a player is a member of more than one club in the pennant competition, she is eligible to play for only one club in any one season.
- (iii) Playing members from YMGCR, Commercial Albury, Corowa, Howlong and Thurgoona Golf Clubs are eligible to play pennant in the NEDGA provided they comply with the requirements in item 3.2
- (iv) If a player does not comply with the above eligibility requirements she will be disqualified and her match forfeited. Refer to section 5 (ii) on p.8

4. Organisational requirements:

4.1 Team Lists

The Captain (or delegate) of each team must provide to the host club representative, a list of their team players at least 30 minutes prior to the scheduled hit-off time of its first match. This should be entered on the Pennant Team & Score Sheet by the host club representative. The list of team players must be in numerical order from the No.1 player (lowest handicap) player to the No. 5 player (highest handicap) and must be in exact G.A. Handicap order.

The team named first on the draw shall be Team 1 on the Pennant Team & Score Sheet.

(While players are listed on the team lists from 1 to 5, players shall play in reverse order, i.e. from player 5 to player 1).

Players who play in the incorrect handicap order as shown on the team sheet will be disqualified and have their match forfeited as shall players who are subsequently wrongly placed in the order on the sheet. Refer to section 5. Scoring on p.8

4.2. Starting tees, late arrival, walkovers and result sheets.

- (i) Matches will commence from the designated starting tees at the times and in the order listed on the draw unless otherwise advised by the NEDGA Match Committee. Players are to be at the starting tee no less than 5 minutes prior to the commencement of their match.
- (ii) If a player arrives at her starting tee, ready to play, within five minutes after her starting time, the penalty for failure to start on time is loss of the 1st hole. Play will commence from the 2nd hole. If both players arrive at the starting tee, ready to play, within five minutes after the starting time, play will commence from the 2nd hole with the match all square.
- (iii) If a player arrives at the starting tee more than 5 minutes after the starting time the penalty is disqualification.
- (iv) In exceptional circumstances (ii) & (iii) may be waived if the player/s arrive 30 minutes after the first pair hitting off in her/their team, the player/s will be allowed to play in the last position of the team. ('Exceptional: meaning illness, car break down, family problems or the like).

- (v) If a Team consists of fewer than 5 players, walkovers will be given from the 5th position. If a club intends to give a walkover in an individual or entire contest, the captain or manager of the opposing team and the host club should be notified if possible, at least the day prior to the match. If a walkover has been given, the opposing player or team need not be present on the day of the match. Refer section 5 p.8
- (vi) If a Club forfeits an entire Contest, the Match Committee of the NEDGA may impose a fine on the club not to exceed \$50.00. If however the forfeit is due to tragedy or other exceptional circumstance, no fine shall be imposed. Full points will be awarded to the opposing team if entire contests are forfeited. Refer section 5 p.8
- (vii) **Signing Pennant Team & Score Sheets.**
Once scores for each match are checked with **both** players it is to be recorded by the host club on the Pennant Team & Score Sheet. Each Team Captain must then sign the Pennant Team & Score Sheet. **This is the only sheet requiring signatures of both Team Captains and is to be emailed to nedgawomen@gmail.com.** Incorrectly recorded scores and unsigned sheets could result in disqualification of both teams.

4.3. More than one team from one club

Where Clubs have more than one pennant team, players must play in handicap order both between teams and within the team. However,

- a player may remain in a particular team provided the player begins the season within the correct handicap range and has played two matches in that team (such players to be known as “same team players”).
- If a player who remains in a team for this reason and therefore possibly out of handicap order in relation to other players in a different division from the same club, she is prohibited from playing in a lower division (e.g. from division 2 to division 3) for the remainder of the season including a play-off or final.
- A player who has played two matches in one division may play in a higher division (e.g. from division 5 to division 4) if handicap restrictions permit (i.e. for Division 1 with a G.A. Handicap limit of 20), but once that player plays two matches in the higher division she cannot return to the lower division for the remainder of the season, including in a play-off or a final. She may play in the final in the higher division.
- *If a club has 2 teams in the same division, a player must remain in the one team for the entire season, including a play-off or final.*

It is the expectation of the NEDGA Match Committee that the system of having players playing out of handicap order in various club divisions will not be abused and will be used purely to keep teams as a ‘same team’ for the season.

4.4 Scratch & Handicap play

If both Scratch and Handicap match play is scheduled in the one pennant season, players may play both scratch and handicap pennant during the season provided they are within the prescribed handicap range for that division. These players will not be categorized as “same team players” as in 4.3 above

4.5 Honour, match duration and hit-off order.

- (i) A coin shall be tossed by the starter at the tee prior to commencement of the match to see which team may have the honour.
- (ii) All matches will be played over eighteen holes from the tee markers as directed by the host club. If a match is square after the completion of eighteen holes, the match will cease and the game score will be halved. In a Final if a match is square after the completion of 18 holes, play will continue until one player secures the advantage. Players need not continue if a winning team result has been determined (i.e. one team has 3 points or more).
- (iii) The penalty for any player playing in the incorrect team position is disqualification (loss of match).

5. Scoring:

(i) Points

Contest points: One point shall be scored for each team win (including wins by forfeit). Where a contest is all square (i.e. 2½ and 2½) half a point shall be awarded to each team.

Match points: One point shall be awarded for each individual match win. Half a point shall be awarded where an individual match is squared.

Game points: Game points are to be used only if there is a tie when determining the teams to play in the final. In such cases Game points will be awarded according to the winning score for each of the five individual matches on each pennant day. For example: for a win of 4/2, 4 game points will be awarded. No game points are awarded for players who lose or square. In the event of a tie remaining, the Match Committee shall arrange a neutral course and date for a play-off and all matches shall continue until a decision is reached in each match.

(ii) Forfeits, cancellations, retired injured or unwell, disqualification

In the event of a player forfeiting, retiring hurt or unwell during a match or being disqualified, one match point shall be awarded. No game points will be awarded.

In the event of a contest being cancelled, match points will be halved and game points if needed will be 2 to each player for each individual match.

If contests are cancelled or abandoned due to inclement weather, the Pennant Team & Score Sheet will be filled out with the names of the players scheduled to compete that day, to enable them to qualify for finals. The sheets are to be submitted in the usual way, just as if the matches had been played.

(iii) Eligibility for Finals.

A player is only eligible to play in the final or a final play-off if she has played a minimum of two matches during the pennant season in that particular division. In the case of a division consisting of 5 teams, the requirement is that she must have played one match in that division.

6. Pace of play

- (i) All players are expected to complete 18 holes in a maximum time of 3 hours and 45 minutes (approximately 12 and 1/2 minutes per hole). In exceptional circumstances (such as extreme weather/playing conditions), the Match Committee has the authority to modify this time requirement. When playing in fours, 14 minutes would be considered a reasonable time to play each hole.
- (ii) The first match shall be considered out of position if it is taking more than the average time specified above, per hole.
- (iii) Any following match will be considered out of position if it
 - falls a clear hole behind the preceding match; and
 - is taking more than an average of 12 and a half minutes per hole to play, or in the case of playing in fours, 14 minutes.
- (iv) If a match is out of position, loss of hole penalties may be issued by the host club member responsible for pace of play. This person is required to issue 2 warnings prior to imposing penalties. If this occurs the matter must be reported to the NEDGA Match Committee.
- (v) If both players in a match are equally contributing to an unacceptable pace of play, they may be 'walked' a hole(s) until they are considered to be in position. If this occurs, the matter must also be reported to the Match Committee.

7. Mobilised Transport.

- (i) Players and caddies are not permitted to ride in or on any form of mechanical transport during the play of a hole.
- (ii) An exemption to (i) may be granted by the NEDGA Match Committee for a player or caddie who suffers a permanent disability or medical condition or who is recovering from serious illness or injury that does not permit them to reasonably walk the golf course.

The following must be emailed to nedgawomen@gmail.com to gain exemption:

- (a) A certificate or letter from a Medical Practitioner specifying:
 - (i) the disability by which the player or caddie is affected
 - (ii) the Medical Practitioner's opinion that the disability necessitates the player or caddie to use mechanical transport in order to participate in the competition
 - (iii) the period of time that the exemption has been requested for e.g. 1 week, 1 month , 1 year or indefinitely

Note: Only medical certificates from general practitioners will be accepted. Medical certificates from osteopaths, physiotherapists, podiatrists etc, are NOT recognised and will consequently not be accepted.

Exceptions:

- (i) Permission to use mechanical transport is not required by any player or caddie upon reaching **70** years of age or in *Extreme Heat* conditions (refer to Section 10 p.10) Cart usage during any NEDGA event would still require any individual to comply with any club requirement and/or cart availability. Players with NEDGA approved medical exemptions must get priority when cart availability is limited.
- (ii) When a player has been granted NEDGA permission to use mechanical transport, the player's caddy is permitted to ride with the player without separate permission required.
- (iii) Mechanical transport may be used to carry a player or caddy in the interests of pace of play where necessary without penalty e.g to use toilet facilities or return to tee after lost ball.

A permanent **or** temporary approval for the use of mechanical locomotion will be made in the case of a player or caddy affected by a disability. Once approved, the applicant will receive a confirmation email from the NEDGA Match Committee informing them of the outcome. A record of approved applicants will be kept by the NEDGA Match Committee. Only the applicant's name, home club and the expiry date (if not permanent) will be kept. No specific medical conditions will be recorded.

Caddies:

Where a caddy has been approved to use mechanical locomotion, during the stipulated round, the following must be adhered to:

- (i) The player does not accept a ride at any time.
- (ii) The player does not accept advice from any other person travelling with the caddie.

Medical certificates can be presented during the pennant season if an injury or medical condition arises during this time.

Breach of this condition.

The penalty for breach of this competition condition by a player or caddie is as follows. At the conclusion of the hole where the breach is discovered, the player is penalised by deducting one hole for each hole at which a breach occurred; maximum deduction per round – two holes.

Use of any unauthorised form of transport must be discontinued immediately upon discovery that a breach has occurred. Continued use of the unauthorised form of transport is disqualification

8. Caddies:

Caddies are not encouraged but are permitted prior to the finals. Players must inform the opposing team of their intention to use a caddy the day prior to a match taking place to ensure the opposing player has the option of bringing her own caddy. The caddy cannot be used if the opposing player/club has not been notified as above.

Professional golfers or professional caddies may not act as a caddy at any time.

9. Distance measuring devices:

Players may obtain distance information by using a device that measures distance only. However, if during a Pennant match, a player uses a distance measuring device that is designed to gauge or measure other conditions that might affect his/her play (e.g., gradient, wind speed, temperature, etc), the player is in breach of Rule of Golf 4-3, for which the penalty is disqualification, regardless of whether any such additional functions are actually used.

10. Suspension of play and abandonment of contests:

- (i) In the event of heavy rain, lightning, fog, extreme heat, unplayable course conditions or for any other reason, the NEDGA Match Committee and/or designated representative of the Host Club will be responsible for deciding whether to cancel, suspend or resume play. The procedure when play is suspended is outlined under Rule of Golf 5.7
- (ii) If the course becomes suitable for play, players will be advised to return to their various locations. Every effort should be made to complete all matches on the scheduled day.
- (iii) If the NEDGA Match Committee or host club representative determines that completion of Pennant is not possible on the scheduled day and less than half the matches have been decided, the round will be abandoned and no scores will be recorded.
- (iv) *Extreme Heat.*
When the temperature at the hosting course is forecast to be **36 degrees or above by 12pm on the day of play** there will be no restrictions on the use of carts. Cart usage will still require any individual to comply with any club requirement and/or cart availability. Also, players with NEDGA approved medical exemptions must get priority when cart availability is limited. If the temperature is forecast to be **38 degrees or above by 12pm on the day of play** the Match Committee may decide to cancel all contests. The forecast will be checked on the Weatherzone App or website <https://www.weatherzone.com.au/vic/north-east> at approximately 12pm the day before play. Team captains will then be notified by email and if possible, by phone.

11. Mobile phones:

The use of a mobile phone whilst on the golf course during an event is distracting and inconsiderate. Mobile phones should be turned off. If the phone rings this is deemed to be in use and the NEDGA Match Committee may take disciplinary action against the offending player. Players/caddies are permitted to make phone calls from the course to the clubhouse or to Rules Official for rules/emergency assistance.

12. Protests:

Any protest must be made in writing on the day of play and emailed immediately to the NEDGA Match Committee (nedgawomen@gmail.com). All protests will be reviewed at a properly constituted NEDGA Match Committee meeting and their decision will be final.

13. Code of Conduct:

All players, caddies and club officials are required to abide by the NEDGA Code of Conduct. In the event that a person is reported for a possible breach of the NEDGA Code of Conduct, the report will be considered by the NEDGA Match Committee.

2020 Women's Pennant Information for Captains and Players

Captains are to read the NEDGA Women's Pennant Competition Conditions and to ensure that all players receive the following information.

All Pennant games must be played in **G.A. Handicap** order through all grades. For clubs who field more than one team, please refer to Pennant Rules and Conditions Rule 4.3 p.7.

It is the responsibility of the players to know their current G.A. Handicap and to ascertain their correct Daily Handicap for the days' play. Host clubs are to ensure they have the Slope Rating for the course where play is to take place displayed in a prominent position so that all players are aware of their correct handicap for the day.

No player is allowed to play on a Daily Handicap greater than 45.0 regardless of their G.A. Handicap. The G.A. Handicap limit for Division One shall be 20.0.

- Matches will commence in reverse order i.e. 5-1 in all divisions through the season and in the finals.
- Players are to verbally agree on final game score before they leave finishing hole.
- The Pennant Team & Score Sheet is to be carefully checked after all play finishes and signed by both Team Captains. Refer to Condition 4.2 (vii).
- The host club must email the Pennant Team & Score Sheet to **nedgawomen@gmail.com** by 5pm on the day the contest takes place. Incorrectly signed sheets may result in disqualification of both teams (Pennant rule 4.2).
- We recommend that any clubs, with players new to pennant or sandgreens, discuss with them the rules / etiquette of Matchplay and Sandgreens.
- Pennant players must familiarize themselves with the Local Rules when they arrive at a club.
- If you cannot field a team, please phone your opposition and host club to advise you will only be bringing 'X' number of players so their opponent does not travel to a club only to be told she has a forfeit and will not be playing.
- A competent person must be in charge of sending out the field and completing the Pennant Team & Score Sheet. This person is to make decisions (*as in the role of a referee*) and their decision must be in accordance with the Rules of Golf and is final.

- **Catering:** -Tea/coffee with biscuits/sticky buns will be provided free of charge by the host club when players arrive at the course. The club will also provide sandwiches with mixed fillings as well as slices and/or fruit for lunch for the players at a cost of \$10.00 per player. Team Captains shall collect the money for their players and hand over the \$50 to the host club prior to commencement of play.
N.B If a member of a Pennant Team has special dietary requirements, it is the responsibility of the team captain to notify the host club. (24 hours notice).

- **CLUBS PLAYING IN 4'S**

A 'Format for Playing in 4's' recommendation is included in this Handbook (p.14). Where required, please copy this form for match day. One copy must be given to the starter of the day and another to the Captain of the opposing team.

For the Clubs where Pennant is played in 4'S, (*Yarrawonga/Mulwala*), we ask that the two extra players provided (swingers) are on similar handicaps to the players in that Division. NB: When playing as swingers, these players are NOT to participate in ANY club event or competition.

2020 Women's Pennant Information for Host Clubs

BEFORE TEAMS ARRIVE

- Provide a Host Official to prepare cards and Pennant Team & Score Sheets.
- Provide a Tee Official.
- Ensure Local Rules are prominently displayed.
- Ensure Daily Handicap Look up charts are to be available for players to ascertain their Daily Handicap before play.

TEE OFFICIAL

- Be familiar with the Local Rules.
- Suggest players read the Local Rules before heading to the 1st Tee.
- Collect cards from person handling the Pennant Team & Score sheets.
- Take the first group to the tee 10 minutes prior to hit-off, to ensure games commence on time.
- Remind players of the pace of play, i.e. they should not take longer than 1 hour and 45 minutes to play 9 holes (For games played in two's).

AT THE TEE

- Captains toss to determine which team has the honour.
- Remind players of the local rules and any special conditions on the course.
- Players hit off in reverse order, i.e. Number 5 first, then down the line, the player with lowest handicap being last to hit off.
- Players must check their handicap is correct.
- Players must determine the holes they give/receive shots from the MATCH PLAY column.
- Players identify their playing ball with each other.

COMPLETION OF PENNANT TEAM & SCORE SHEET

The Host Official is to:

- Receive a team list from each Team Captain detailing player, Golfink no. and G.A. Handicap and complete the Pennant Team & Score sheets (NB: The home team is team number 1, or the team named first in the draw).
- Check they are correctly listed in handicap order, lowest to highest.
- Complete the Pennant Team & Score Sheet for each team and record the results.
- After the matches are completed, check with Team Captains that the Pennant Team & Score sheet has been filled in correctly.
- Have both captains sign the Pennant Team & Score Sheet. If an incorrect sheet is signed, it may lead to disqualification.
- Email the completed and signed Pennant Team & Score Sheet to nedgawomen@gmail.com by 5pm on day of play. An email with a clear photo or a scan of the Pennant Team & Score Sheet attached is acceptable.



2020 Women's Pennant Format for Playing in 4's

In 2020, 4's will be played at Yarrawonga/Mulwala only.

When playing in 4's, there is to be **no communication between team members** that could influence a player's choice of club or course management. Penalty for breach of this will be loss of hole.

Following is the recommended format for sending pennant fields out when playing in 4's.

Where a Division has 6 teams:

First Tee Time:

The two teams hitting off first are to be sent out in handicap order 5-1. Example: - Players ranked 5 are to be sent off first with the two swingers (*provided by the host club, whose handicap is to be equal or as close to the number 5 players*)

Players ranked 4 & 3 are sent out next, and then players 2 & 1 follow them.

N.B. Swingers are not to participate in any form of club event. E.g. match play. They are only there to even out the playing field.

Second Tee Time:

The next four teams are to be sent out in handicap order-

All 5's

All 3's

All 2's

Where a Division has only 5 or 4 teams:

Both matches will hit off at the same time. The host club will no longer be required to supply swingers.
