### **NEDGA EVENTS**

The NEDGA coordinate various events and tournaments throughout the year to promote inclusion regardless of gender and golfing ability, provide an opportunity for players from various clubs to meet others from across the district and to establish Champions of various events on a yearly basis.

These events are held at Member clubs on a rotational basis. The NEDGA provides an event subsidy to the hosting club as well as opportunity to generate further income from sundry sales (e.g. lunch, bar takings, raffles etc.).

### **TOURNAMENTS**

Annual tournaments held by the district are;

- Opening Day – Open to all members of the district
- Women's Opening Day – Open to all female members of the district
- Judy Guilfoyle Cup – Open to female members of the district
- Women's District Championships – Open to female members of the district
- Men's District Championships – Open to all male members of the district
- 4BBB Championships – Open to all members of the district
- Play 9 District Final – 2 male & 2 female members from each club of the district
- Women's Sand Green Championships – Open to female members of the district
- 2 Ball Ambrose – Open to all members of the district
- Men's Sand Green Championships – Open to all male members of the district
- Sally Symonds 4BBB – Open to all female members of the district
- Mixed Foursomes – Open to all members of the district

### **SUBSIDY**

That hosting fees for above tournaments conducted by the NEDGA is set at a minimum of \$200 with a maximum of \$500 for one day events. For District Championships that are held over three Days to be set at a minimum of \$500 with a maximum of \$1000 for the three days.

Payment of fees to be determined based on the entry fee and fields sizes

### **OTHER**

Clubs to set lunch amount and will be included in the entry fee to help with catering numbers prior to the event. Lunch money and hosting fees will be paid together to the club after the event.
