

Standard Conditions for NEDGA Women's Competitions

Entry forms will be available on Team App and emailed out to Clubs approximately 4 weeks prior to competition

1. To be eligible for this Competition, players must be financial playing members of NEDGA with an officially recognised Golf Australia Handicap.
2. It is the player's responsibility to ascertain their correct daily handicap. Unless otherwise specified in individual event conditions, the maximum playing handicap for all events for women, is 45.
3. The competition shall be played in accordance with the R&A USGA Rules of Golf (January 2023) subject to such local rules as are in force on the course over which the competition is played and/or NEDGA Match Committee.
4. The NEDGA Match Committee makes all the arrangements, and has full power to alter the conditions, should they deem it desirable, and shall have the right to refuse entry of any person without being required to give any reason for such refusal.
5. In the event of bad weather, or for any other reason, the NEDGA Match Committee may shorten the competition, appoint another day or days for completion of, or may transfer play to another course.
6. Protests must be made to the NEDGA Match Committee not later than 15 minutes after the conclusion of each round. The decision of the NEDGA Match Committee will be final in all matters relating to the tournament.
7. Entry Fees must be paid at the time of entry via Golfbox. Any entrant may withdraw and have their entry fee refunded providing notification is received on or before the event closing date, by emailing nedgawomen@gmail.com. No entry fee will be refunded to a competitor withdrawing after the draw has been published, unless the NEDGA Match Committee approves special circumstances.
8. The NEDGA Match Committee reserves the right to limit the number of entries. In the event numbers exceed the capacity of the course the time of receipt of any entry will determine if you are placed in the field.
9. Motorised carts are now allowed. Medical certificates are no longer required. It is the responsibility of the player to comply with any club requirements regarding cart usage. When cart availability is limited, consideration should be given to those players who are unable to play without one, i.e would have to withdraw from the event, rather than those who just like to play in a cart. Any disputes regarding cart usage are to be resolved between the players and not by the Match Committee.
10. The use of a mobile phone whilst on the golf course during an event is distracting and inconsiderate. Mobile phones should be on silent or vibrate only. Players/caddies are permitted to make phone calls from the course to the clubhouse or to Rules Official for rules/emergency assistance only.
11. For all NEDGA tournaments, a player may obtain distance information by using a device that measures distance only. If during a stipulated round, a player uses a distance-measuring device that is designed to gauge or measure other conditions that might affect her play (e.g. gradient, wind speed, temperature, etc.) the player is in breach of Rule 4-3, for which the penalty is disqualification, regardless of whether any such additional function is actually used.
12. A player is prohibited from having a professional golfer serve as her caddie during the tournament.
13. Players must report 15 minutes before the starting time. At the discretion of the starter any player not ready to commence play when called upon may be placed at the end of the field.
14. **In the event of a tie** there shall be a countback according to Golf Australia recommendations.
15. Extreme Heat; For days of extreme heat, players will abide by the extreme heat policy of the hosting club in consultation with the NEDGA Women's Match Committee recommendations



If time does not permit, there shall be a countback according to Golf Australia recommendations. Ties in the daily scratch and all handicap events shall be decided by a count-back according to Golf Australia recommendations.

In the event of a tie in the Pam McCormick Trophy, there will be no count-back. Multiple winners will be awarded.

Trophies are awarded to the 36 hole Scratch and Handicap winners and more than one trophy can be won by the same person. Monetary prizes will go to the winners and runners up of A, B and C Grades in both scratch and handicap events

No caddies allowed for Championship rounds.

Motorised carts are allowed without a medical certificate. **It is not allowed to change to a motorised cart part way through the round, however.**

Merit Award Conditions

The Merit Award has been introduced to encourage players to attend bowls or tournaments at clubs other than their own and to support all clubs, large and small, when they hold their annual events.

- To be eligible and to be awarded points in this event, a player must be a financial member of the NEDGA or be a financial member of an Associate Member Club of the NEDGA.
- Points will be awarded to the District players who return the best scores in an 18 Hole individual event as nominated by the club. Clubs may nominate only one event per year eg. Tournament or Bowl. Nett scores in stroke events, best scores in par and highest points in stableford competitions.
- Points toward the Merit Award will be as follows:
 - 5 Points for best nett, par or stableford score.
 - 4 Points for second
 - 3 Points for third
 - 2 Points for fourth
 - 1 Point for all players attending (excl players from Home club)
- Countbacks are not applicable. If two or more players have the same score, they receive the same number of points and are all classed as first or second or whatever position they came.
- No points will be awarded to members of the Home club. If a player is a member of more than one club in the District, "Home club" is defined as where player's golf link no. is held.
- In the event of a tie for the Merit Award the player who has scored points in the most events will be declared the winner. In the event of a further tie the player with the most 5 points, then 4 points etc. will be declared the winner.
- The NEDGA Match Committee shall have full control over the result.
- A full field results report is to be given to NEDGA Match Committee member on the day or **emailed to nedgawomen@gmail.com as soon as possible** after the club event is held.
- The winner will be announced at the Sally Symonds 4BBB event and presented with a prize and a \$100 Drummond Voucher.

NEDGA Brooch Competition

Previously, proceeds from this competition have been used to support our junior golfers or the NE Women's Country team. Now, the NEDGA Brooch will be an annual competition for the women of affiliated NEDGA clubs. The winning score from a player at each club will receive a free entry to the 2026 NEDGA Women's District Championships. Those players who have qualified at the club level will compete for the NE Brooch on Day 1 of the Championships, the best nett score from these players will win the NE Brooch.

1. **Club Qualifying;** The Competition is 18 holes Stroke Handicap and will take place at each NEDGA Affiliated Club on its own course, on ONE specific day in the month of **APRIL**. The entry is \$2.00 per player, which entitles a competitor to return a card in one designated stroke event held within her Club during **APRIL**.
2. Amateur players may compete at any NEDGA Affiliated Club of which she is a member.
3. The club winner will be decided by the best nett score on this specific stroke round at their club. Each club winner will receive free entry to the NEDGA District Championships (to be played at Wangaratta GC on 2nd/3rd of June 2026) to play in the NE Brooch final on Day 1 of the championships.
4. **Finals;** The best nett score from Day 1 of the champs (2nd June) from those who have qualified at the club level will be the NE Brooch winner. In the event of a tie, a count back shall be done as per Golf Australia regulations. The NE Brooch will be presented by the NEDGA Match Committee at the NEDGA Women's Championships.
5. The below form must be completed in full and emailed with proof of the player's stroke score (either a card or a printout of the player's mi-score result) to nedgawomen@gmail.com before or by 11 May 2026. **Entries received late and/or without the player's card/score confirmation will not be accepted.**

Golf Victoria Country Teams

Golf Victoria Country Teams is an annual competition played between Country Districts of Golf Victoria. It can also be known as Country Week Teams' Matches. Golf Victoria divides the teams into three divisions. The competition consists of teams playing 'round robin' contests of scratch matchplay between districts in each division. Each district selects a team of ten players with seven players competing in each match.

The Women's Country Week Teams' Matches were first played in 1933. The competition began to give country players the opportunity to play on leading Melbourne golf courses. The prestigious trophy for which they compete is the Alice Coltman Cup donated by the first President of the Ballarat District Ladies Golf Association. Each year the winning teams of Division 2 and 3 are promoted into the next division and the losing teams of Division 1 and 2 are relegated to the lower division.

The North-Eastern (NE) District has a winning history to be very proud of in Country Teams competition. Not only have we kept our place in Division 1 for the majority of this competition (known exceptions, 1972 & 2006) but have won the Alice Coltman Cup 25 times. From 1981 to 1998 we won the cup in 14 of the 18 years, including eight years in row from 1991-98. Then from 2002 to 2012 we won another seven times, with four of those in a row with our latest victory being in 2018.

Following on from last year's Country Teams event that was held on the Bellarine Peninsula, this year's event was held in the Mildura District at Mildura GC, Red Cliffs GC and Riverside GC. The players for the NE gave it their all with some impressive wins and down to the wire losses. The outstanding team effort saw them finish a close third in their Division. Thank you and well done for your efforts to our 2025 team of Susan Wood, Leeanne Carmody, Di Murphy, Vicki Walsh, Kellie Roberts, Alison Comensoli, Susan Oakley, Tania Zentveld, Marie Barnes and Linda Terry.

Clubs are invited to nominate their low handicap players (< GA 18) for potential selection into this year's NEDGA women's team. To be eligible for selection, a player must be a member of a Victorian affiliated club in the District they represent, irrespective of residential location. Players must have played a minimum of 5 competition rounds at either the affiliated country club or in designated District events in the preceding 12 months for the player to be eligible. **The preceding 12 months is the 12 months from 30th September 2025.**

Note: Non-stroke or individual Club or District events such as Pennant, Foursomes, 4BBB or Ambrose will also count towards the minimum of 5 competition rounds. As long as they are either NEDGA events or played at the Victorian affiliated club.

It is an honour to be selected in the team and represent the North-Eastern District at Country Teams, whether as a player or caddy.
